Our teachers are very collaborative, working together, constantly learning, challenging, and supporting each other.

Highview Public School is located in the Downsview community in the Jane/Wilson area of Toronto. The school was built in 1956. A two-storey addition was built in 1971 adding a new gym, a library, and five more classrooms.

- The school serves approximately 200 students, born in Canada and around the world.
- The Highview-Wilson Childcare is housed in the school building.
- We have three Special Education classes. One for Kindergarten children, two for students with developmental challenges.

We engage in team planning and professional learning communities to ensure consistent delivery of curriculum across grade levels. We continue to develop our literacy and numeracy rooms.

Student Life - Where You Belong


