Student Life - Where You Belong

Students at Rippleton have many opportunities to participate in a variety of sports, music, academic, dance, games and art activities. Many students choose to do Mad Science where they investigate different scientific problems, or learn Chess in a fun way, during lunch. Others might join the guitar club or learn Hip Hop dancing, participate in the sketching club or try out for one of the many sports teams running throughout the year.

Students also participate in a variety of Leadership programs that build self esteem and offer ways in which to develop positive role models and contribute to the development of the younger students. Grade 5 and 6 students can be table supervisors for the grade 1-3 students during lunch time, or become Student Ambassadors which sign students in and out for safety during recess times for the washroom and drinks. As well, there are opportunities for partner work with younger grades and classroom assistance for primary teachers when appropriate. These skills help our junior students to explore their interpersonal skills and interests while making positive impact on their school community. They do an incredible job!
