Breakfast Program

Offering students a nutritious meal at the beginning of the day improves their academic performance and attendance, according to a TDSB study which confirms what people have known for years. With that in mind, our Breakfast Club serves a balanced and delicious breakfast and is open Mondays to Fridays from 8:00 to 8:30 AM. All students are welcome. The Breakfast Club is funded by donations from parents and sponsors in the community. As of late January, our Morning Meal Student Nutrition Program provide a healthy morning snack to each student.

Restorative Practices

adults help them to take personal responsibility for their actions. Restorative practices fosters dialogue to resolve conflict. Children who feel valued and connected at school are more likely to feel engaged and less likely to act out inappropriately.
